
OUR REGION: THE « HAUTS DE FRANCE »

Its capital city is Lille.




This is the main square of Lille...

The Chaîne des Puys, the largest volcanic ensemble in Europe, is located in metropolitan France. It is composed of inactive and potentially active volcanoes




